Message from Headteacher

What a week to visit Kings'! Our Open Evening and Open Morning events were incredibly successful and are reflected in this message from a visitor "We wanted to say what an incredible experience we had walking around Kings' this week as a parent. Osbourne School, our partner school in our OsKings collaboration (which provides a highly inclusive environment for pupils at Osbourne School to learn at the Kings' site) had their Ofsted visit last week. The visit highlighted the enormous benefits to both schools of the project. The inspection report will reflect this once it is released in due course.

It was wonderful to welcome our Year 11 parents on to site this week for our Parents' Evening. Parents and staff really welcomed the opportunity for personal, face to face conversations about their children and their progress, even if the volume of parents meant that car parking was a challenge!

Whole class reading in Tutor times.

If you drop into some tutor times in Years 7 - 9 this half term, you will see whole classes engaged in interesting reading activities. The Reading Project is being piloted by two tutor groups in each year group: three time a week, they start each day by reading a novel together for 10 minutes, with a member of staff reading out loud to the class and the whole class following along. At times, there will be 'guest readers' who drop in to take up the story, as senior colleagues and the Year teams also participate.

Following this project, the aim is that after half term, this will be expanded so that all tutor groups across Key Stage 3 will have the same experience. Activities and information will also be provided for each tutor group so they can use this opportunity to expand their vocabulary and to learn more interesting facts related to the contexts of the novels.

We are very excited about this initiative because we know, looking at the research from around the country, that improving the quality and frequency of our pupils' reading will significantly support their learning across the curriculum. For those pupils who love reading already, we hope this will be a fun and stimulating way to promote their passion amongst their peers.

Spotlight on Kings' staff

MRS REBECCA BAXTER PASTORAL SUPPORT WORKER



What is your role in Kings' and what inspired you to do this role?

I work as part of the Welfare team as a Pastoral Support Worker. I qualified as a Youth and Community Worker in 2014, and spent the first seven years of my career in a variety of communitybased youth work roles, including drop in centres, youth clubs and LGBTQ+ groups for 11-25 year olds. In 2015, after having my first child, there had been cuts to youth services across the UK, so I decided to pursue school-based roles so I could continue the work I am most enthusiastic about; working face to face with young people.

What is unique about your role at the school?

I am not a member of teaching staff, so I don't spend much time in the classroom. I have the privilege of helping young people when they are having a difficult time whether due to unexpected life events or mental health issues, or even the pressures of school. I spend a lot of my time listening to pupils and signposting (and referring) them and their families to specialist services that can support them through a variety of issues. I work with external agencies such as CAMHS, local counselling services and Family Support Workers/Social Workers. I enjoy being part of the wider network of support for a person so that they can overcome difficulties and achieve their potential.

What do you enjoy most about your role?

I enjoy getting to know the pupils I work with over the course of their time here at Kings'. I love being part of the busy community of a secondary school and seeing young people arrive as nervous y7's and leave as confident 'almost adults' ready for the world of college and work is really fulfilling, especially if I know I have had a small part to play in supporting that pupil on their journey into adult life.

What are your future ambitions and what do you hope to achieve during your time at Kings'?

I love being part of the pastoral team and developing the way we offer pupils support during their time with us. Whilst it is challenging, and not a job many would want to do, I get a lot of job satisfaction from being one of the school's DSL's and working to safeguard children. During my time here, I hope to achieve a reputation for being a kind, proactive listener that advocates fiercely but professionally for all our pupils!



It has been a very positive start to the new academic year for all OsKings' pupils . They have settled well and been made very welcome by all King's staff and pupils. They continue to integrate and as a result feel very relaxed in their new surroundings. Pupils are enjoying attending lunchtime social clubs with King's pupils in the new Oskings' provision helping them build new friendships.

Osborne School, including OsKings' had an Ofsted inspection last week and whilst walking Kings' School at lunchtime the inspectors were extremely complimentary about the integration during lunch break. They believed that integration between OsKings' pupils and King's pupils was largely because of the positive attitude and relationship between staff and pupils. The aim is to continue to develop opportunities to integrate, building on the positive start to the year.
