Updates for the parents of KINGS'

HEADTEACHER'S MESSAGE

After a deserved half-term rest for staff and pupils alike, Kings' immediate focus has been the Year 11 mock exams which will run up until the 11th November. Pupils are finding the experience of the mock exams invaluable and are approaching them with maturity and purpose. Also on the 11th, we will hold our Remembrance Day service, with a whole-school event on the middle field, to commemorate the end of hostilities during the Great War in 1918. This will be the first time since 2018 that we have been able to hold this event on this scale, and we are hoping for the weather to be kind to us so that we do not have to revert to a more streamlined indoor version. This will be presided over by the Reverend Neil Birkett, former Deputy Headteacher at Kings', and Steve Brine MP will be in attendance.

Looking towards Christmas, there are many other exciting events happening, including the KSA Comedy Night, The Kings' Carol Service at Winchester Cathedral, and our Christmas Fayre.

At the end of the summer term, we held an open event to discuss the school toilets with parents and we continued these discussions with pupils last half term. We are looking at two aspects relating to the feedback we received. Firstly, we will ensure that our current facilities are as good as they possibly can be at all times; and secondly to explore increasing the capacity of our toilet facilities. In response to the first part, we will be increasing the cleaning / checks on pupil toilets so that they are all checked after each movement time. We are investing in additional staffing capacity to support this. Regarding toilet use, you will be aware that we strongly encourage pupils to use the toilets during movement time, rather than during lessons. However, we recognise the need for flexibility with this. Our review of toilets is being conducted by our new School Business Manager, Ben Culleton, who was introduced you to in the Vol 2 - 23rd September newsletter. This work is part of the generation of our strategic site development plan. This includes considering: additional classroom space, additional small group working spaces, toilet capacity, updating the library, updating the Astroturf, updating the changing room facilities, updating the front entrance area of the school and reviewing our IT infrastructure. More details of the plan will be shared early in the Spring Term.

I am delighted with the start to this half term and am very much looking forward to seeing you at our upcoming events.




HOLLAND FOOTBALL TOUR

HEAD OF HEALTH AND SOCIAL CARE/CHILD DEVELOPMENT

What attracted you to a career in teaching?

I have always loved sport and used to play football for Portsmouth Women (and maybe Saints for a couple of seasons but I keep that quiet!). Being a professional was not an option for women back then so I decided to become a PE teacher. I have a love and passion for sports and encouraging children to lead active and healthy lifestyles.
