UPDATES FOR THE PARENTS OF KINGS'



EQUALITY AND RIGHTS ADVOCATES



Hampshire Equality and Rights Advocates (EARA) is a group of students from secondary schools across the county who work collaboratively to promote equality and child rights in their schools, based on the nine protected characteristics of the Equality Act and the UNCRC. We present to students, teachers, governors and parents in our school communities and come together once a term to share our work and discuss ways forward. The group have designed a badge which unites us together.

We are an active student voice group in our schools, which supports Article 12 of the UNCRC which says that children and young people have the human right to have opinions and for these opinions to matter.

The most recent meeting took place on Wednesday 8th March when our EARA group travelled to Deer Park Secondary School. Together with representatives from eight other Hampshire schools we listened to an excellent talk by guest speaker, Liz Hubbuck, from the Office of the Police and Crime Commission Youth Division. The talk centred on the subject of Hate Crime and Hate Incidents, and how to differentiate between them, as well as what to do in the event of hearing or seeing a hate crime.

The Kings' EARA group then presented our findings from our recent survey on Attitudes towards LGBTQ+ people within the school. The survey was completed by over 500 pupils and staff and gave an insight into the way people think and feel about this important issue. We have concluded from our findings that more needs to be done on the subject of what it means to be an ally, and we hope to address this in future assemblies.



ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE



Car Park Upgrade

Starting from Monday 20th March, contractors will be working in the Kings' School main car park and surrounding area, adding additional parking spaces, landscaping and planting around the OsKings' building, and planting new trees elsewhere on the premises. Parents/carers and visitors should be mindful that whilst the car park will remain open, there will be a reduction in staff parking capacity for 4 weeks. The work is expected to finish in time for the start of the summer term on 17th April.

This is an excellent opportunity to improve our staff parking facilities and add more trees to our green and pleasant site. There will also be an improvement to the front of the school as bushes will be planted alongside the front fence beside OsKings'. We welcome the addition of tree restoration as we play a small part in tackling the climate crisis.

Changes to school uniform provider

Due to the changes in Government guidance concerning the cost of school uniform, we have taken the decision to make changes to our uniform and the way it is purchased. This will be a transitional change, leading up to 2027, so uniforms of current pupils will not require changing. More details are provided in the attached letter click **here.**

ANTIBULLYING

Kings' School - working together to build our safe environment

At the heart of school family is a desire to ensure that all of our pupils feel safe and happy when they are on site. We continue to focus on this within school on a day to day basis.

Over this academic year we have worked hard to give pupils greater peace of mind around safeguarding and bullying. We have added a variety of different ways in which pupils can report any concerns and in our Personal Development Curriculum, we have ensured that educating our pupils about equality, diversity and inclusion is central.

We are also very excited that our Pupil Leadership Team, have decided to undertake a legacy project around equality and bullying. In the coming weeks they will be launching this to pupils, with ideas like a 'pupil drop in' clinic hosted by the Pupil Leadership team and other prefects - giving other pupils a safe space to raise more general concerns. Within these sessions the Pupil Leadership Team will be offering advice on the best people and places to go to in school for support with their worries. In addition to this, their aim is to train Anti-bullying ambassadors within Years 7 – 10. These pupils will help deliver the message around the importance of equality to their own year groups. The Pupil Leadership Team are hopeful that by creating these ambassadors it will allow their introductory work to continue once they leave. They are looking forward to their first assembly to get their message out to the rest of the school. In the words of Allison, (Deputy Head Girl). "Change starts with you, change starts with us, and change starts with everyone here at Kings', so as the Pupil Leadership Team we are going to start to work together on this, we are excited to be part of this legacy project."

We are confident this will further empower the pupils here at Kings' to actively support our inclusive ethos and ensure that the message around zero tolerance to bullying is supported by our whole community. We know that none of this is done in isolation and we are grateful to all our pupils' families for emphasising the same message in their homes. Working together, we are building a strong, safe and secure environment for all our pupils, both in school and in their surrounding communities.

Boys' football is enjoying something of a purple patch with three of our sides through to the Hampshire cup semi-finals and our new rugby specialist Mr Breen oversaw the Under 15s narrowly defeated 14-7 by local rivals Westgate in the Hampshire Cup Semi final.
