## EXCEPTIONAL CHARACTER





Each autumn the Head of Year at Kings' School has identified a small group of pupils in Year 9, whom it is believed would benefit from the opportunity of studying vocationally based courses at Sparsholt College as day-release options throughout Years 10 and 11.

Presently our pupils enrol on LINKS 14/16 entry level qualifications in Animal Care, Horse Care or Motor Vehicle Studies.

Interested pupils have a taster day at the college, followed by a written application and a formal interview.

The courses are a blend of practical / physical skills and classroom studies. Each course has approximately twelve pupils. This allows our pupils to develop their interpersonal and communication skills, and further teaches them the value of working as a member of a team to achieve their objectives.

Since 2014, 120 Kings' pupils have studied on LINKS courses at external colleges.

Our pupil experiences are overflowing with success stories and evidence of achievement.

On two occasions in the past five years our pupils have found that they are the only Kings' pupil studying on their course. Each has been the only person in their school cohort of 350 to have achieved their particular qualification.

Last year, one of our Year 11 pupils won the "Best Student" Award on the motor vehicle course. He is now studying at a higher level in the motor vehicle department at Basingstoke College of Technology, working as an apprentice with a local garage, with a vision two years into the future of further specialising in electric motor cars. Using his Sparsholt experience he has mapped out a clearly defined career path, matched by his personal determination to succeed.

The majority of the Kings' pupils re-enrol at the Sparsholt College as progression to a higher level in their chosen area as they have decided that it is an environment with which they are comfortable and they are content with the teaching style they have experienced.

#### CATHEDRAL ARTWORK

For the second time, Kings' School pupils have had the opportunity to exhibit their work in the majestic surroundings of Winchester Cathedral. "Inspired by our Cathedral" brought together Artwork produced by our GCSF students.

They created a unit of work, resulting in a final piece, inspired by Winchester Cathedral. On a number of occasions over the summer and throughout the autumn term the students visited the Cathedral to gather photographs and sketches to inspire them in their work. They have had extensive tours with the cathedral guides, learning about the history, the architecture, the spiritual ethos and the art of this unique building. This has helped to create some long lasting and valuable connections and was an integral part of the initial brief in encouraging the students to become familiar with the cathedral. Some of the pupils have also visited Paris as part of their research for this unit and others have travelled further afield over the summer and autumn term collecting resources and being inspired by cathedrals in other countries.

The students have explored a rich and varied range of media, techniques and processes in their aim to create a thought provoking exhibition that will challenge the audience and engage them with their surroundings. Students took part in a workshop with visiting artist Ian Murphy as part of the programme of study for this unit, with kind sponsorship by Winchester Arts Society. It gave the students a sound understanding of how an artist works in the real world along with invaluable experience of using more diverse techniques and materials. The work in the exhibition includes Art and Textiles, based on a brief that incorporates the themes of "Hidden Figures", "Colour", "Pattern and Texture", "Architecture" and "Illumination".

We are delighted to have a second chance to reconnect with the cathedral and exhibit the students' work here. This initiative was born from a desire to develop closer connections with the Cathedral and the community and to show the students the wonderful resource that is on their doorstep. Whilst most of our students live in or around Winchester, many of them had not visited the Cathedral before this project. The Cathedral is at the very heart of our community and as such should be appreciated and enjoyed by all. The richness of the Cathedral and its contents gave all the students a wealth of resources that have been used to great effect to create a stunning display of preparatory studies and finished pieces.

Kings' School would like to offer their sincere thanks to the Dean and Chapter of Winchester Cathedral for welcoming us and allowing this exhibition to take place.

#### Introducing our Pupil Support Co-ordinators

We are delighted to be able to introduce new roles and responsibilities within the Pupil Support Department.

#### Inclusion and Diversity Coordinator - Jo Nash

I am Jo Nash and I am a long-standing member of staff from Pupil support. I love being part of a small team that carry out physio programmes during the school day.

In my new role I help run an afterschool wheelchair basketball club that is open to all. We have 10 sports wheelchairs that we are able to use. Come and have a go on a Monday after school in the gym. I am passionate that our SEND and FSM pupils have opportunities in all sport and activities whilst at Kings'. My aim in my role is to increase participation across the school by working with staff and students to help them get more vulnerable students involved.



#### Literacy and dyslexia coordinator - Jenny Cann



I am Jenny Cann and I am the new Dyslexia and Literacy Co-Ordinator in Pupil Support. I have worked as an LSA at Kings for the past 8 years and my role has developed over that time to include dyslexia screening and supporting pupils with dyslexia and literacy difficulties. In my new role, I will be continuing to screen pupils for dyslexia and support them with strategies for effective learning. I will also be working closely with Lucy Marsh to identify pupils who would benefit from some support with Literacy and then delivering that support in the form of 1:1, group, and classroom settings.

#### Numeracy and ICT Coordinator- Amy Horsman

I am Amy Horsman and I am the new Numeracy & ICT Co-Ordinator in Pupil Support and have been an LSA at Kings' for 3 years. Many of you will know me as Amy Bell, but after getting married in the Summer I have decided this is the perfect opportunity to make the change. In my new role I will be working alongside Pupil Support and the Maths Department to identify and support pupils with dyscalculia numeracy difficulties, and intervention in 1-1 and small group settings. To begin with this will involve lots of research and trials of resources and methods to help us find the best ways of identifying and supporting those pupils most in need. In addition, I will be assisting pupils and staff around the use of technology and software to access learning through programmes such as DocPlus and Claro Reader, providing additional support during exam seasons



#### EAL COORDINATOR - ALINA ABYZOVA



I am Alina Abyzova and I am the new EAL (English as Additional Language) coordinator in Pupil Support My surname is hard to spell or remember. Pupils know me as Miss AAA. I've been working at Kings' as an LSA since November 2019, and as an LSA with EAL responsibility since January, 2021. In my new role – an EAL coordinator – I will be responsible for coordinating the provision for EAL students which involves supporting their integration and learning as well as supporting subject teachers. I believe in an inclusive, multicultural, diverse school community where bilingualism is seen as an asset as each EAL pupil brings along a unique language, cultural and education background, and individual personality. #### Inclusive Learning Coordinator - lisa smith

I am Lisa Smith, and I am the Inclusive Learning Coordinator, based in the Tower. I have worked at Kings' coordinating provision for pupils in BASE and now in HUB for 5 years. I work with pupils who find transition to secondary School more challenging. I support pupils with strategies to aid their confidence so that they can work independently and successfully in class. I work in collaboration with Pupil Support, Welfare, Heads of Year, class teachers and am part of the Inclusive Learning Department. The pupils I work with follow the curriculum, with lessons being shared by their timetabled teachers which I deliver in the calm, quiet environment of HUB.



#### Community fundraiser

The Pakistani and Indian community in Hampshire came together in a gesture of friendship and unity to host an Indo-Pak food festival on Sunday 26th Feb to raise funds for the Turkey/Syria earthquake disaster relief and Southampton Children's Hospital.
