EXCEPTIONAL CHARACTER

Spotlight on staff MR WILL LOCKE assistant headteacher

What attracted you to a career in teaching? I originally trained as a mechanical engineer, designing and installing manufacturing lines for the food industry. I spent a year working with Walkers' crisps, setting up



potato slicing machines and peelers. Whilst I enjoyed the problem solving and design processes, I soon realised that it was quite a lonely undertaking, often spending days on end designing and tweaking without much interaction with others. I reflected on what I enjoyed most about work, and it was the people I met, as opposed to the task itself, so I considered careers which would lead to more of this. In addition, my mother was a Geography teacher, and had always advised me against going into teaching, so that was the only motivation I needed to go for it. From the very start of my PGCE, I realised that I had made the correct choice. I loved (and still do) the unpredictable nature of a school day and the wonderful relationships we can build with the youngsters in our care. I trained as a Maths teacher as I have always enjoyed the problem-solving nature of the subject, which has served me well as I've graduated onto timetabling and managing data systems across the school.

Tell us why pupils enjoy coming to your lessons. I hope that students in my lessons feel they have the opportunity to express themselves in a safe, proactive environment. Good teaching is all about building

relationships and enabling young people to build confidence. Maths in particular can often be a subject for which confidence is a real barrier to learning. Parents casually stating they "were never any good at Maths", or challenges from Maths learning in primary school can easily lead to an acceptance that the subject is just difficult, and therefore it's ok to give up when it gets tricky. By rebuilding confidence where necessary, and regularly highlighting progress, we are able to slowly develop a positive, can-do approach to learning which is key to the exceptional character we value so highly.

What do you enjoy most about working at Kings'?

I have been struck since joining Kings' by the atmosphere around the school. The students are a credit to the school, and I have witnessed many examples of exceptional character already. Staff have been especially welcoming, with the result that I already feel like a member of the team. Joining a new school is always tricky and coming into a senior leadership position provides additional challenges, but I have been grateful for the support I have felt from the first day. I'm looking forward to settling into the new role in the coming weeks and contributing fully to the life of the school.
