OPENING OF THE NEW ASTRO TURF PITCH

Kings' School, Winchester celebrated the re-laying of its astro turf pitch with a Festival of Hockey on Sunday 8th October with hundreds of participants and spectators. In temperatures peaking at twenty-six degrees and more typical of June than October, the school welcomed current and ex-pupils, members of Winchester Hockey Club and the England Over 40s Spirit of Masters Hockey team.

The day started with a minis session, involving one hundred Under 8 and Under 10 boys and girls from the Winchester Hockey Club junior section. The session was in part led by a number of Kings' pupils, many of whom enjoyed the Spring tour to The Netherlands. All of the minis are relatively new to the game but enjoyed a carousel of skills challenges and some small sided games. Next on the programme was the Kings' U16 Boys' hockey team vs the Kings' Alumni men's side. The game was played at a fast and furious pace, with the alumni side drawing a number of excellent saves from Kings' U16 goalkeeper Finn Lacey. The alumni side have all individually enjoyed successful club and in many cases, University hockey playing careers, so established a 3-0 lead. But the Kings' side never gave up and an excellent move from Rory Jack and Matthew Richman, put England Lions player Tom Nolan through to blast a diving tomahawk into the roof of the net for the goal of the day and a respectable 3-1 score line.





The Kings' Girls' Under 16 side were next to pit their wits against a Ladies Kings' Alumni side, featuring a number of current Kings' staff and Winchester Hockey Club players. The game ebbed and flowed but the composed, clinical finishing of the Alumni side was the difference with them eventually running out 6-0 winners. Bea Eaton and Amelia Wakely, alongside Finn Lacey, Rory Jack and Tom Nolan from the boys' side have recently made it into the South Coast Talent Academy which is a huge achievement for them individually and for the school and club.

Head of PE, Mr Alastair Birch, gave a short speech, recognising the contribution of a number of individuals whose hard work ensured that the school and the club now have a fantastic new blue hockey surface. He also thanked all the players, umpires and attendees as well as the volunteers who had cooked food or manned the various stalls throughout the day. Winchester Hockey Club chairman, Andy Craig reflected on the strong links between the school and the club and the importance of such a great facility for the school, club and community for the next ten years.

Before the final match of the day, all present first fell silent and then offered a minute's applause in memory of Nicky Ellis, Pam Fisher and John Goodman, all of whom were club stalwarts who sadly passed away this year. And the final game was a fitting tribute to all three, with the Kings' Men's Alumni going toe to toe with the England O4os Spirit of Master's side, who played in the World Master's Hockey European Championships in the summer. The Kings' Alumni side created a number of good chances before Craig Jeffrey broke the deadlock in the second half. With the bare eleven, the England side responded with a number of good chances of their own before Stuart Clark finished with aplomb to leave honours even.

BATTLEFIELDS TRIP 2023

Across the 3 day trip, visits were made to Vimy Ridge, Langemark Tyne British Cemetery, German Cot Cemetery, Essex Farm Cemetery & Dressing Station, Talbot House and Museum, Ypres for the "In Flanders Fields" exhibition and the Menin Gate, Newfoundland Park, Thiepval Memorial & Visitors Centre, and Lochnagar Crater. At each stop, the magnitude of the purpose of the trip sunk in a little further. The children were impeccably behaved, showing respect and thoughtfulness in their studies of each spot, and sharing reflections on how different the world might be without some of the brave souls who were lost in the Great War. I want to ensure that the voices of all children in the Winchester area are fairly represented in the findings so that I can share their views with the most senior members of the country.

I must reiterate that it is vital that all children have their voice heard through this survey because, as Children's Commissioner for England, I have a statutory duty to protect and promote the views and interests of children. The Big Ambition provides a much-needed opportunity for the children of England to tell political decision makers what is important to them ahead of the General Election. I will be sharing their responses with Government to ensure that children's voices are heard.

Please share the survey and resources with teachers in your school and encourage them to use it in their lessons. Children can complete the survey in assemblies, form times, PSHE or in other lessons this term. The survey can also be done as homework and parents can assist children who cannot complete the survey themselves (children under 5 and children with Special Educational Needs). This is a great opportunity to teach children about politics and why it is important for them to use their voice. Be sure to check out the lesson plans on my website if you want to teach your pupils more about politics before they fill in the survey!













