It was a delight to be able to return once again this year to the extraordinary building that is Winchester Cathedral for our Kings' School Carol Service. The service comprised a mixture of congregational carols, instrumental interludes and choral items sung by the various school and adult choirs, culminating in a massed choir performance of Cleobury's "Joys Seven" , with 220 performers singing together in 4-part harmony. Each year an adult choir is formed of past and present staff, governors, ex pupils and parents, and it is always a pleasure to catch up with past pupils and learn of their ongoing musical achievements years after they have departed Kings'. This year, we were joined by Thomas Fagg, who is now studying at Peter Symonds College. CyberFirst

40 Year 8 girls have been taking part in the annual #CyberFirst competition, dedicating a lot of time to tackling challenges from cryptography and logic to artificial intelligence and networking for the chance to be crowned cyber security champions.

We had twelve teams competing, amassing a total of 12550 points between them, with 'The Random Trio' ending up as school winners with 2405 points. We are now waiting to see how we are placed in comparison to all the other teams who participated around the country.

Bebras

In November over 1000 pupils took part in the Bebras Computing Challenge, which introduces computational thinking to pupils, designed to get pupils all over the world excited about computing. By the end of the first week in December pupils will receive their certificates. There were 117 pupils who achieved a Gold award, finishing in the top 10% nationally. They will receive invites to take part in the Oxford University Computing Challenge, the first of which round takes place in the middle of January.

SPOTLIGHT ON STAFF Mrs Tayyaba Rauf - matron

I started working at Kings' School exactly six years ago, and it has been quite a journey in multiple roles across the school. My background is in public health, but I ended up in the education sector simply because we were new to



the country, having moved from Pakistan, and it was convenient at that time to start off with local part-time work. I began with catering in Kings', moving on to being a Cover Supervisor, tutor, Science teacher, PE cover teacher, and now to a full-time role as the school Matron. It has been challenging yet extremely rewarding to do justice to all these roles, but brilliant to be a part of so many different teams and forming incredible relationships with staff and pupils alike, over the years.

Running the medical room, along with my colleague Mrs Peters is a full-on, high adrenaline job. As Matrons, we administer pain relief medication to children feeling unwell due to all kinds of ailments, provide first aid treatment for bumps, scrapes, minor and major injuries. We are responsible for all our diabetic, epileptic, asthmatic and anaphylactic pupils. I liaise with the school immunisation team, and logistically organise the mass vaccination of our pupils in school for flu, HPV, MMR and teenage booster vaccines. There is a buzz of activity in the medical room all day, and it is a satisfying feeling at the end of the day after caring for the health of all our pupils.

I love all kinds of sport and it was a privilege to work with the PE department for six months, a few years ago. My colleague Mrs Kaine and I run the weekly after school Badminton club, which is very gratifying, with some of our pupils returning year after year to play with us. I regularly help the PE department with their local and international tours. The Holland Hockey Tour earlier this year was a particularly memorable experience with some exceptional pupils and staff members. I also love to cook, and with my colleague Mrs Hussain, run the Crackin' Curry stall at the annual Kings' Summer Fayre which has garnered a lot of attention.

I have three sons, all of whom have benefited from the extraordinary learning environment of Kings.', where they thrived and formed lasting friendships. My eldest son is at university, middle one in college, and youngest here in Year 10. My husband works in the telecom industry. Being local to Winchester, my family joke that I can never step out of the house without getting a greeting of 'Hello, Miss' from a current or former pupil! For me, I love the respect and acknowledgement from these wonderful youngsters. Moving to this wonderful country from Pakistan seven years ago was an incredible life change for my family, but definitely one for the better, and we are grateful and happy to now call England our home.
