


Why is attendance important?

- Central to raising standards in education and ensuring all pupils can fulfil their potential is an assumption so widely understood that it is insufficiently stated – pupils need to attend school regularly to benefit from their education.
- Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind. Children with poor attendance tend to achieve less in secondary school.

Reminders about attendance

We all feel in our comfort zone if our child is achieving a high percentage in tests/assessments and 80% in a test is generally excellent news! The danger is that we may feel the same way about attendance until it is explained!

If a child has an attendance percentage of 80%, then this is equivalent to **missing a whole day of school every single week**.

If a child has an attendance percentage of 80% each year from Year 7 to Year 11, then this is equivalent to **missing an entire year of school**.



Since the start of the year, 10,524 recognition points have been issued to year 8.



Reports

Attitude to Learning is now reported under 4 different headings: all of them relate to the characteristics of an 'Exceptionally Successful Learner'

- Exceptionally successful learners will attain or exceed their target expectations throughout their time in education. In order to achieve this, their attitude to their learning is exemplary:
- They are **curious** exploring ideas and asking questions in order to further their own understanding, both within the classroom and at home.
- They actively work to develop their vocabulary through reading widely and using words taught in class.
- They welcome feedback, acting on the advice of teachers and want to continue to improve their work, even when it may be difficult.
- They behave in a **calm and thoughtful** manner, displaying courtesy and understanding towards other members of the school community, at all times.
- They **revisit material** as part of their home learning, checking for their own understanding and asking questions of teaching staff if they do not feel confident.

ATL Descriptors

- Always: In this subject, your child exhibits all or nearly all of the characteristics of an exceptionally successful learner, all of the time.
- **Mostly**: In this subject, your child exhibits some of the characteristics of an exceptionally successful learner, however, there are still areas they could work on to ensure they meet or exceed their target expectations.
- **Sometimes**: In this subject, your child has exhibited some to these characteristics on occasion, but they need to do this consistently, focusing on each of these areas as targets for improving their attitude to learning.
- **Rarely**: In this subject, your child's current attitude to learning is slowing down their ability to make progress. In order to be a successful learner, they need to begin to work on these target areas. Unless this change happens, your child will struggle to meet their target expectations in this subject.



Top tips... to get the best out of school



- Give encouragement and acknowledge your child's achievements
- Enable them to have good personal organisation skills including teaching them to manage their time (don't do it for them!)
- Be realistic and avoid putting your child under pressure by having overly-high expectations of them
- Try to give feedback rather than criticism, ask them questions and encourage them to reflect, so that they can see where they went wrong and not just feel like a failure
- Have an open dialogue, create time for your relationship to grow

Top tips for keeping up with school...



- Check you can login to Edulink One and that you can access information about attendance, progress and clubs
- Check you can access Satchel One for monitoring your child's homework
- Encourage your child to join you for parents' evenings and hear their feedback themselves
- Have a set routine to help them recharge, rest and complete homework
- Don't believe everything you hear!

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
