




Spring Concert
















On Monday evening, the Music Department held their annual Spring Concert, featuring an array of ensembles, soloists, bands and duets. The Year 11 band "The Extinguishers" performed a 25 minute set welcoming people as they were taking their seats, before the concert began with an amalgamated choir of pupils from all years performing Queen's "Don't Stop Me Now", accompanied by the Extinguishers. The orchestra featured a guest pupil conductor, Zach Jones, who arranged The March from the Nutcracker, and Rowan Rushall and Gabe Carson led the Jazz band. There were other ensemble items including the Chamber Choir performing "From Now On" from 'The Greatest Showman' with percussion, the Vocal Dectet performing Thomas Tallis' "If Ye Love Me"; Steel Band performing A-ha's "Take On Me", and the Brass Band playing a rousing version of Seven Nation Army. There were a number of soloists in the first half including Isabelle McGregor singing "Silent Worship" by Handel; Eden Baddeley-Gill performing "Ladies in Lavender" on the violin; Fergus Robertson singing a dramatic version of "Dust & Ashes" from the musical 'The Great Comet; Hannah Chakraborty singing a moving rendition of "Rise Up", and Kyle Kwok in Year 8 performing a heavily rhythmical rendition of "Caballos Espanoles", bringing the fiery heat of Spain into Kings' school hall. The second half also featured Gerlyn Teoh on the piano, Russell Pasley on the cello, Ethel Damalerio & Rowan Rushall performing an acoustic version of "Blackbird" by Lennon & McCartney; Emily Townley who sang with incredible control "I Could've Danced All Night", and Zach Jones & Gabriel Carson concluded the evening with a saxophone concerto.


On Monday 11th March, the shortlist of recently published YA fiction was announced, when Hampshire School Library Service Lead Adviser, Emma Ostler, visited Kings' to bring us brand new copies of the books.

The aims of the HBA are:

- To promote the enjoyment of reading
- To foster a reading ethos within the school
- To draw attention to the most rewarding and accessible fiction for the age group
- To challenge students to critically assess books and to make a reasoned argument in group discussions.

Over the next three months our judges will become highly critical readers, looking at the "Three Es" of reading – Enjoyment, Enrichment and Engagement, as they consider every

aspect of what makes a book a page-turner and a possible future classic.

Video Games Club - Wednesdays after School

On Wednesdays a buzz of excitement sweeps along the upper corridors of Sarum building as pupils from all year groups make their way to Video Games Club.

A group of our regulars from Year 10 and 11 set up a bracket style open sign up event weekly, in which pupils pit their skills against one another in games such as Smash Bros, Mario Kart and Dragonball Z Fighter.

What attracted you to a career in teaching?



I think the desire to inspire. There are so many negative influences in young people's lives today; coupled with a sort of 'downer' on being bright, pursuing greatness academically, and being a shining light that way. I want to paint a different picture, to expose them to an alternate narrative which says, "Go ahead and shine, blow them away with your brilliance and be proud of it".

Tell us why pupils enjoy coming to your lessons.

The Q&A session with the Chancellor provided further depth and engagement with fiscal policy.


