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

Hampshire Book Award 2024

Way back in March, a number of Year 8 pupils applied to become judges in the annual Hampshire Book Award (HBA)- one of the most prestigious events in the county calendar. A total of fourteen outstanding "book dragons" made it onto the judging panel, and for the next three months, threw themselves into reading and discussing every aspect of each book. On the 2nd July, the judges, accompanied by Mrs Miles, made their way to Applemore College in Dibden Purlieu. Here they got to meet and mingle with judges from other secondary schools across Hampshire. There were enthusiastic discussions as the judges debated the merits of the six shortlisted books, and having just spent the past three months reading these books and analysing them in great detail, the chat was both lively and informed. The six books on the shortlist covered different genres and styles and presented our judges with a challenging experience, yet they rose to the challenge quite magnificently. But in the end, the judges reached a unanimous verdict and the winner was Electric Life by Rachel Delahaye, a powerful and thought-provoking dystopian novel set firmly in a future, rather bizarre, London. Congratulations to our Year 8 Judges who aquitted themselves brilliantly on the day and throughout the competition.

This was Mrs Miles's final HBA, having trained a cohort of judges every year since 2004, and she couldn't be prouder of this conscientious, diligent and thoroughly nice team of Year 8s.

Hampshire Equality and Rights Advocates (EARA) are a group of students from secondary schools across the county who work collaboratively to promote equality and child rights in their schools, based on the nine protected characteristics of the Equality Act and the UNCRC. They present to students, teachers, governors and parents in their school communities and come together once a term to share their work and discuss ways forward. The group have designed a badge which unites them together.

PowerPoints and materials presented are circulated following the meetings and can be used by the network in their schools. EARA are an active student voice group in our schools, which supports Article 12 of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child which says that children and young people have the human right to have opinions and for these opinions to matter.



Members of the Kings' School EARA group delivered their own PowerPoint presentation on the subject of Hate Speech to pupils from seven other schools.

We are inviting families with school-aged children (who live or attend a school in the city of Winchester and some surrounding areas, including Alresford) who feel they need some extra help over the school holidays to register for our Holiday Lunch Scheme.

The aim of the scheme is to provide food to cover 5 lunches per child per week. Please note that the holiday lunch scheme is in addition to our normal operation, and does not count towards the number of standard vouchers you can receive. However, we ask that you don't claim both during the same period of time. Please be aware that the food supplied is designed to replace the hot meal and will be tinned/dried; we do not have food items suitable for packed lunch style meals. We can offer food suitable for most dietary requirements.

This summer we have 4 locations for you to collect from:

Bar End (The Vineyard Church, SO23 9NR) – Mondays and Thursdays, 10 a.m. – 12 p.m.; Highcliffe (21a Penton Place, Milland Road, SO23 oPZ) – Tuesdays and Fridays, 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

New Alresford (St Gregory's Church, SO24 9HD) - Wednesdays, 10 a.m. - 12 p.m.;

Weeke (St Barnabas Church, SO22 6DS) - Thursdays, 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.

You will be asked to nominate which location you will be collecting your food from – please think carefully about this as we cannot change it!

Collections will be necessary 3 times from your chosen hub – each collection will contain 10 lunches.


