



The pupils took part in a masterclass exploring embroidery, beading and the use of bullion in traditional goldwork, which they thoroughly enjoyed and produced some amazing work. We would like to thank Lucy, Hand and Lock for this amazing opportunity, for pupils to see how they can transfer the skills they are learning in school, into a viable career choice. We would also like to thank Lucy for the incredibly generous donation of materials for the pupils to use which will be invaluable as they progress towards their final exam.

The pupils were joined by the broderers from Winchester Cathedral, Anna Diamond, Margaret Bingham, Janet Roche, Teresa Fuest, Lizzie Aston, Gerry Sollom and Pam Meir from Winchester Arts Society who were very impressed by the work of our pupils and the presentation by Lucy. The pupils have been very fortunate to visit the broderers at the cathedral and see the huge amount of incredible work they do to conserve existing textiles along with creating new textiles pieces. The Art Department would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank the broderers for their very kind donations of fabrics, threads and beads to the school over the past few years. The pupils have been exceptionally lucky to have such kind sponsors and the materials have been greatly appreciated.



The broderers and Lucy were on hand during the day to offer advice and ideas regarding a whole school project that the Textiles department at Kings' would like to develop.

The old Kings' School flag is being replaced with a new one and in the spirit of conservation/re use/recycle/reinvent, we would like to embellish the old school flag with the textiles techniques we have learnt, as part of our celebrations to commemorate 40 years of King's School.

We will be looking for threads, yarns, beads, buttons, sequins etc but only Burgundy/Red and Gold colours. If you have anything that you think might be of use to us for this project, we would be very grateful for your kind donations.


