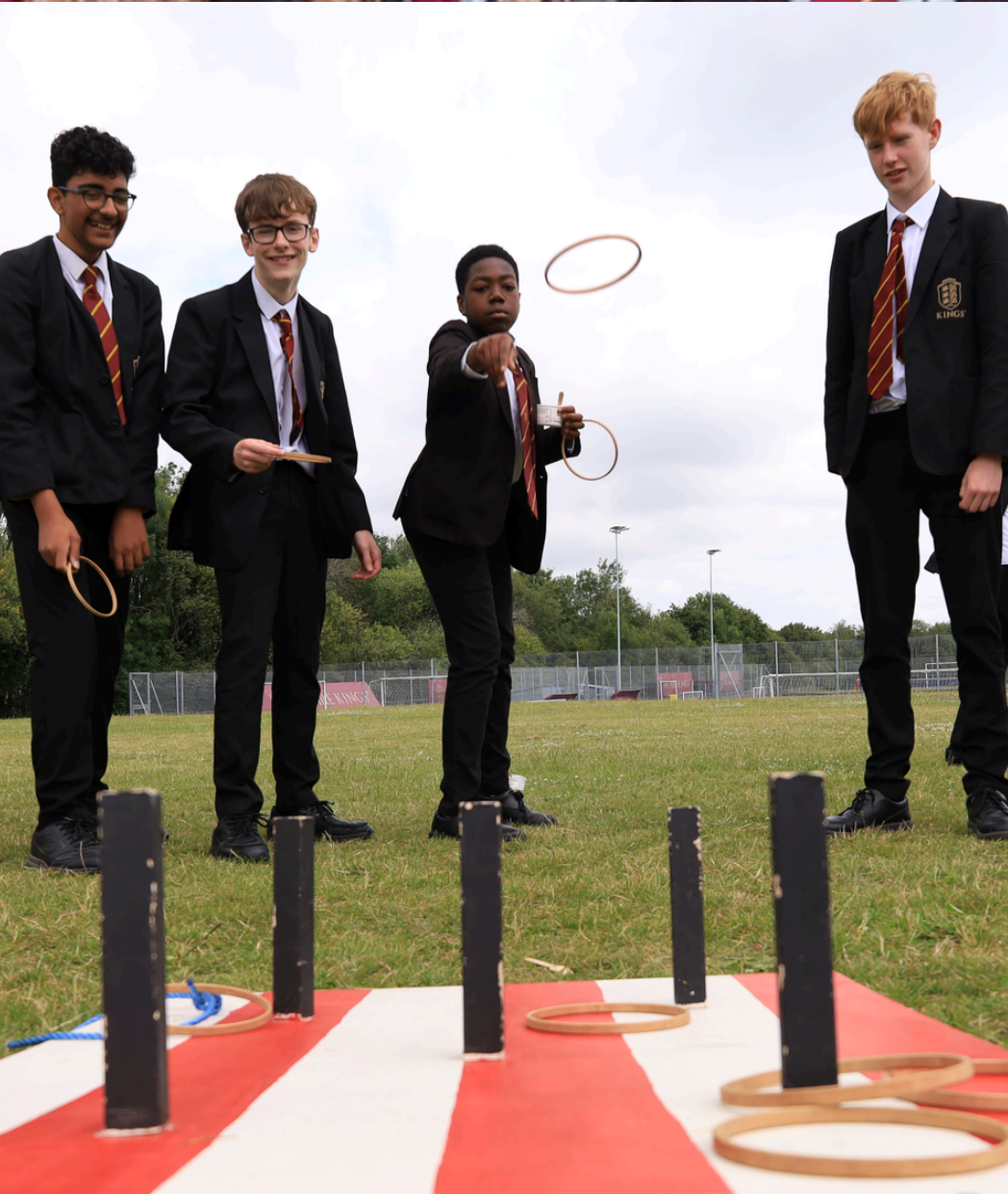

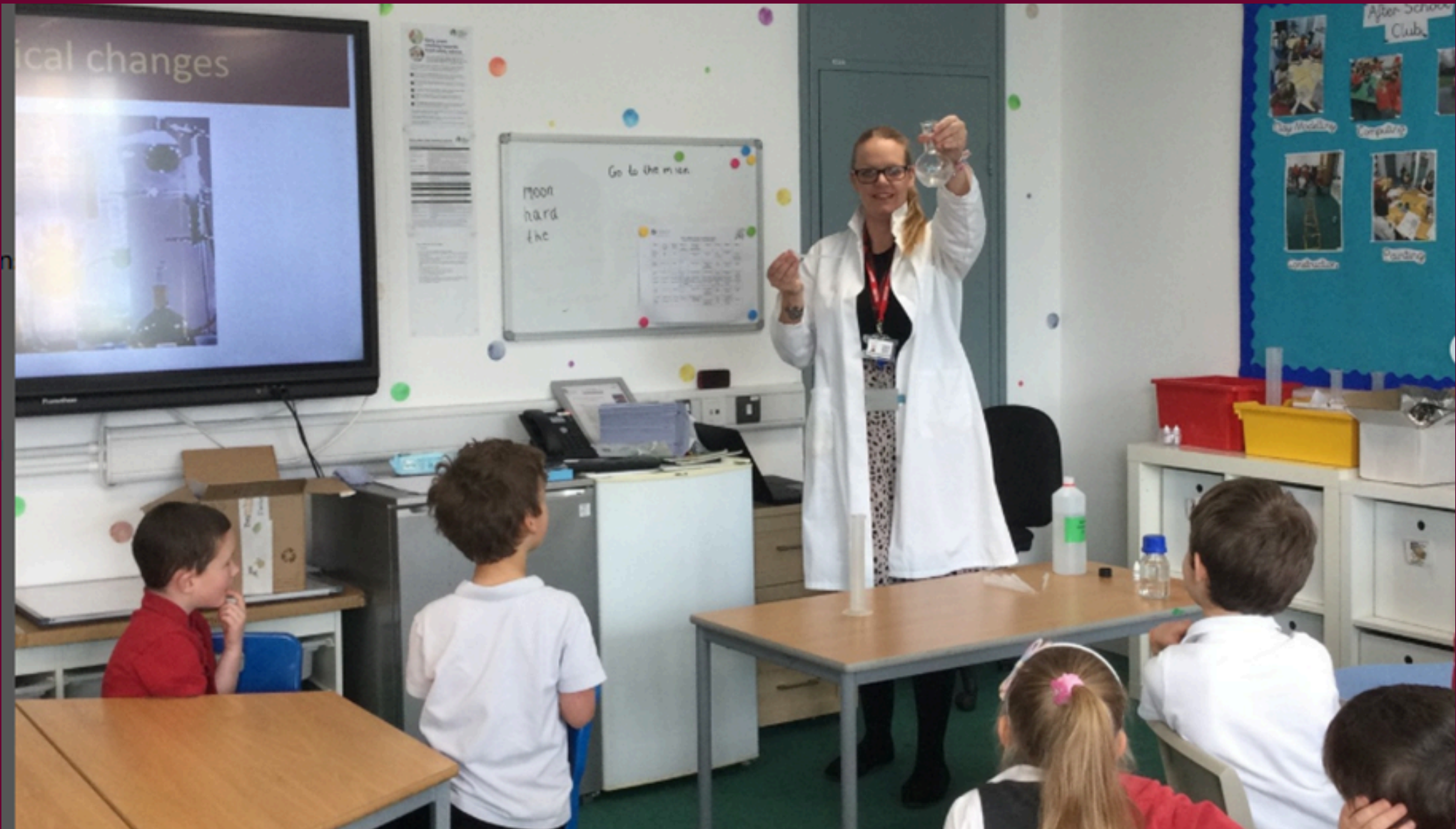




# INSPIRING FUTURES

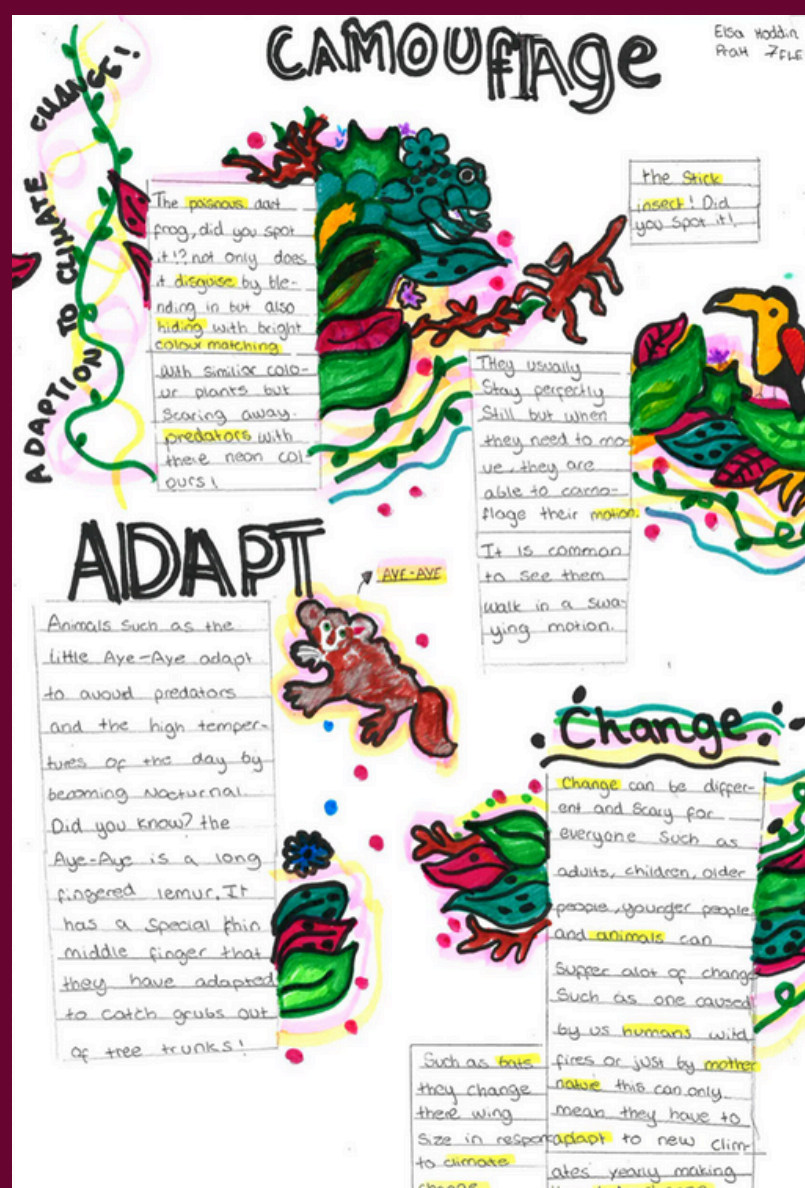


British Science Week saw Kings' teachers hold a week of lunchtime AMA (ask me anything) sessions in the foyer. Pupils could see displays of careers linked to all STEM subjects, read profiles of staff who have joined us from previous STEM careers and question them about their exciting roles.



Congratulations to Elsa Hoddinot-Pratt for her beautiful and informative poster that has won the House Science Week poster competition.

In robotics club pupils have continued to learn how to control our Microbit controlled robots, programming them to follow lines, avoid obstacles and make use of a number of other sensors on the Microbit boards. We have recently taken delivery of a number of sensors and Arduino boards which pupils will be experimenting with after Easter. We hope that this will generate lots of ideas for the many STEM competitions that take place each year.







# LANGUAGES



At Kings', we are proud of the number of languages pupils can learn and receive qualifications, including Spanish, French, German, Italian and Latin. In January Year 7s undertook their first language assessment, and Years 10 & 11 have both undergone modern language speaking and written mock GCSE exams, preparing them for their final year and GCSEs respectively.



In March, 36 from our Spanish class met Spanish students on an exchange visit and spent the afternoon on a walk around Winchester city centre. All pupils were matched in groups with Spanish students and given conversation starters so they could practice speaking Spanish.



Also in March our Latin class went to a regional workshop sponsored by Winchester college, and met with contemporaries all studying Latin





# THEATRE TRIPS



The English Department have truly brought literature to life with an incredible line up of theatre and poetry experiences.

On 29th and 30th January, over 100 pupils each night had the thrilling opportunity to visit the Mayflower Theatre in Southampton to witness the gripping production of *An Inspector Calls*. The suspense, the drama, and the unforgettable staging left everyone on the edge of their seats!

Fast forward to 26th February, and we took over 100 pupils to Poetry Live in Basingstoke—a truly inspiring day filled with verse and insight. Pupils were captivated by Carol Ann Duffy, impressed by Imtiaz Dharker's powerful rendition of *Tissue*, and absolutely delighted to meet the legendary John Agard—always a favourite!



Then, in March, we rounded off our literary adventures with nearly 200 pupils attending a stunning production of *Frankenstein* in Winchester. Not only did they witness this classic brought to life on stage, but they also had the rare chance to engage in a Q&A with the cast, crew, and creative team. Thought-provoking discussions included debates on who the true villain is—Victor Frankenstein or the creature? and the artistic choices behind the depiction of the DeLacey family.

These experiences have truly enhanced our pupils' understanding of their English Literature studies, making learning both dynamic and unforgettable.





# SPORT



It has been a year of unprecedented success for our sports teams at Kings' and is true testament to the dedication of our PE department, pupils and wider staff who help run training and fixtures. There have been 170 fixtures and two tours in 58 school days, covering all age groups, girls, boys and mixed, principally in five core sports, averaging three fixtures a day and with only one day this term without a fixture. We have won regional leagues, a number of tournament trophies, county cups, and even national championships. All those involved have been a credit to the school and themselves, and should be filled with a real sense of pride.

## Hockey

Our hockey teams have had an incredible season, in particular our U14 girls who secured 2nd place at the England Hockey National Tier 2 Finals in February, the only state school to qualify, and went on to win the Tier 1 (state schools) National Competition at Nottingham in March, scoring 35 goals in 7 games - the first Kings' school girls team to win a national title!



Our U16 boys, having won the South Central regional indoor championships, qualifying them for the nationals, and being crown county outdoor champions, culminated a fantastic 5 years as a team making the semi-finals of the Tier 2 National Championships, an unmatched achievement for the school in this age group, only to narrowly lose to Kent College. Congratulations to Tom and Rory being selected for the England international squad and to Matthew, Greg and Eddie called to join the South Coast Talent Academy.



## Basketball

The U16 boys basketball team were undefeated across their entire regular season in the face of some tough encounters. They were up against the strong St Georges team at the Championship Cup Final, and having gone in at half time 17 points down fought back with an indomitable second half to win 70-64. Special mention to Parkin Hui in Year 10 who fired three successful three point shots, the turning point of the game.





## Football

It has been a busy term for football with over 70 fixtures played. The highlight has been the Hampshire Cup runs from the U14 boys and girls teams. Both sides have reached the county final, which will be played in the near future. In addition to this we had a large number of teams reach the District Cup finals.



The U14 girls are the District Cup champions, and the U15 boys won their league. The U13 and U16 boys and U12 girls teams are all still to play their final and have league positions confirmed, most stand a very good chance.

We will be rounding off the season with an exciting tour to FC Utrecht in the Netherlands. 120 pupils from 3 year groups will undertake skills training with academy coaches and each team have two local team fixtures.



## Netball

As we reflect on the 2024/2025 netball season, there is a lot to be said about commitment, effort and perseverance. Regular attendance at training mixed with a healthy number of fixtures really pays off and the improvement across the teams this year has been immense. Testament to this is our U14s, who in the third season together became league winners and PGL tournament champions. The U12, U13 and U16 teams all came 4<sup>th</sup> in their respective District Leagues, each of 9 schools.

All the best to our U16s in their GCSEs, futures beyond and continued participation in netball. For the remainder, it is with great anticipation we look forward to next season!
