
We were privileged to welcome a host of science specialists in June for an extraordinary STEM day, featuring:




ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

SPORTS AWARDS



On 3rd July we hosted our annual sport awards recognising the individual and team achievements, with over 300 individual awards, and celebrating what has been one of the most successful sporting year Kings' has seen. Over the year the PE department have run 350 fixtures, which equates to nearly two fixtures per year group, per week, every week!



59 pupils were celebrated for representing in their sport discipline at County level or above, including international caps for Rory J, Tom N, Zoe J, Lara J, Violet L (Hockey), Saffia R (Football) and Emma M (Cricket) having been selected for the National team.

Over 100 pupils were award their school colours for representing the school in either three (half colours) or four (full colours) sport disciplines.



Notable awards were: Our U14s Girls Hockey team who were awarded **Team of the Year** for an outstanding season, crowned National State-School Champions and coming second in the National all-schools Championships! **Paralympic Legacy Award** - Oli W, an all-time basketball player despite serious challenge and adversity; **Volunteer of the Year** - Matthew R, who gave selflessly his time across a number of activities and shared his excellent knowledge and skills with younger pupils; **Olympic Legacy Award** - Saffia R, who represented the school at a number of sports as an incredible role model and represented England U16 Girls' at football; **Thompson Award** - Rory J, who has been an excellent role model in sport throughout his time at the school, broke the 100m record in 2024 and represented England U16 Boys' at hockey.

You will be pleased to know that we do get out! Here is a group shot of this year's summer staff party held at Winchester Rugby Club.




